Rules:

- Competition rules of the Czech Wushu Federation (according to EWUF).
- Taolu referee groups A and B. Group C for cadets, juniors and adults in modern wushu only. Duilian and taiji referee group B only.
- The competitor is allowed to compete in forms appropriate to his / her age category. The number of categories is unlimited.
- The age of competitor as of 1. 1. 2024.
- Taolu platform – competitive carpets of 8x14 m. Taiji surface – sport floor.

For coaches:

- Register your competitors to their categories by 10. 11. 2024 at www.czechwushu.cz.
- Foreign competitors and beginner competitors shall register by e-mail. Send your registration including your full name, date of birth and competition category by 10.11. 2024 to jan.chudoba@gmail.com.
- Late registration is possible (for already merged categories), however there is a 200 CZK charge in addition to the standard entry fee.
- The team leader shall bring the team registration of the competitors on the day of the competition during the registration time for the purpose of checking. The same person shall also pay for the whole team. It is also mandatory to be on time for the registration and for the competition.
- Take responsibility for your competitors before and during the competition.

Time schedule:

8.30 hrs.	Registration of the competitors
9.00 hrs.	Opening ceremony
17.00 hrs.	Estimated end of the competition

Entry fees:

Junior category: 300 CZK for the first event, 150 CZK each additional event.
Senior category: 400 CZK for the first event, 200 CZK each additional event.
It is possible to pay in Euros at site.

Prizes:

Diploma and medal for the first three places.

Cup for the first place in case of sufficient number of competitors in the category (4 competitors in the category minimum).

Cup for the best team. The schools receive points for the placements of their competitors throughout the whole competition. Only categories with 4 competitors (4 pairs in duilian) minimum are counted into the score. The first place is awarded with 3 points, second with 2 and third with 1 point. The first team / school is awarded with the cup.

Refreshments: There are drink and snack machines in the sports hall. Restaurants and shops are located in the Campus Square shopping centre, which is across the street.

Parking: There is a large paid parking lot in the immediate vicinity of the sports hall. Free parking is available in the adjacent streets. You can also park in the Campus Square Shopping Center across the street (parking is both paid and free).

Additional information:

The spectators are kindly ask to stay in the stands; only competitors, coaches and referees are allowed to the sport floor. Appropriate footwear is needed.

Competitors must wear appropriate clothing and footwear for both sports and traditional taolu. The weapons for sport wushu have to comply with the standards of the CWF rules. The organizer has the right to merge the categories in case of insufficient competitors in the category (i.e. less than four competitors in the category). Only the categories which are closest to each other can be merged. The competitors shall be informed about merging of the categories in timely manner.

The points to the national ranking of CFW will be awarded to the members of the federation only according to their actual ranking.

Minimal time limits for traditional wushu and duilian:

- 20 sec – children up to 8 years
- 30 sec – children up to 11 years
- 40 sec – cadets
- 50 sec – juniors, adults

Taiji:

- Bare hands: 3–4 minutes
- Weapons: 3 minutes (maximum)

Mandatory forms for modern wushu:**Changquan:**

- 16 forms for children up to 8 years
- 32 forms for children up to 11 years
- 1st set of international forms for cadets
- 2nd, 3rd set of international forms and independently created forms for juniors and adults

Nanquan:

- 16 forms for children up to 8 years
- 32 forms for children up to 11 years
- 1st and 3rd set and created forms for juniors and adults

Competition categories taolu:

- Traditional northern fist
- Traditional southern fist
- Traditional short weapons
- Traditional long weapons
- Traditional flexible weapons
- Traditional double weapons
- Wushu competition changquan
- Wushu competition nanquan
- Wushu competition jianshu/daoshu
- Wushu competition gunshu/qiangshu
- Wushu competition nandao
- Wushu competition nangun
- Duilian – weapons / bare hands – for all junior categories together and for all senior categories together

- Chen taijiquan (fist) – men
- Chen taijiquan (fist) – women
- Yang taijiquan (fist) – men
- Yang taijiquan (fist) – women
- Taijiquan other styles (fist) – men
- Taijiquan other styles (fist) – women
- Chen taijijuan (sword) – men
- Chen taijijuan (sword) – women
- Yang taijijuan (sword) – men

Categories shall be divided into men and women

Children 9 – 11 years

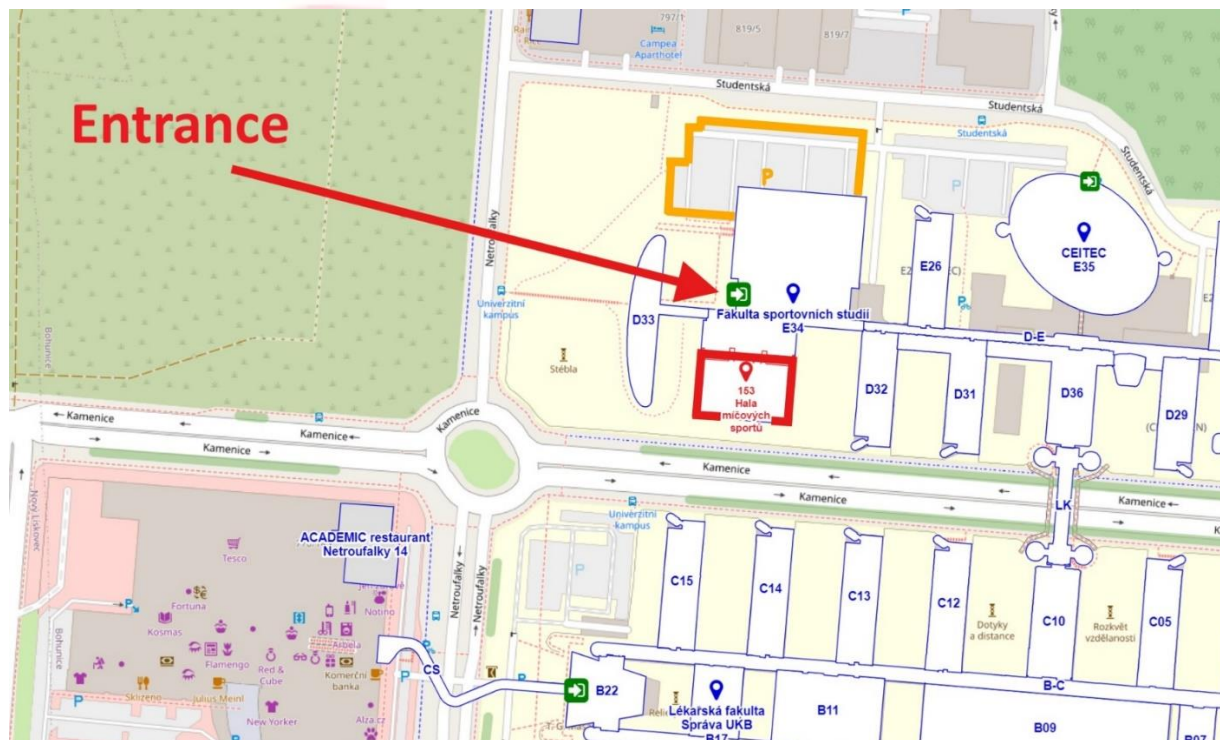
Cadets 12 – 14 years
